





Presidents Report

It is a pleasure to present the 69th Annual Report of the De La Salle Old Collegians Amateur Football Club to the Club and Members.

Year in review

2023 was the first year since 2019 we did not see COVID interrupt our football season which was awesome in so many ways.

Our year kicked of on Feb 12 when Jack Hanley, Hugh Nicolson and Charlie Mcgraw completed a 100km run in one day to launch our mental health and awareness program which is called Out of the Blue. The run raised 30k with all funds being put to support players and mental health awareness around the club.

In March we returned the Sofitel for our annual season launch which attracted over 260 people. The day was once again hosted by Nigal Carmody and we were thrilled to have special guests Nicole Livington, Peter Daicos, Alex Keith, and the Suburban Footballer. We look forward to growing this event further in 2024 as we take the event to our Sponsors venue The Park which is booked in for Friday March 1st.

In Round 1 we had a triple header at home to kick the season off with the Blues knocking off Uni Blues, the Reserves unveiled their premiership flag before knocking off Trinity and the Seniors with 4 debutants were able to get the win against Old Trinity. Our Life Members lunch also took place with over 60 attendees.

Our Mothers Day lunch was another great event with 110 in the room to support BCNA. Our special guest was current AVC sponsor Megan Wallace who told us of her year long battle. We were also lucky to hear from Ruth Hall – Community Bank Malvern East, Holly Bailey – Play Like a Girl and Andrew Simpson from BNCA.

As we progressed into season, we were forced to juggle players as over 30 players headed off for a European Summer. This did not only affect De La but most teams in the VAFA and other suburban comps around the country.

At the season came to an end there were many highlights during the season for all teams. Some of the bigs ones for me were:

- Sam Williams 300th game in an away win over Fitzroy which secured the seniors first finals appearance since 2017.
- The Guns thrilling 1 point win at home vs Wattle Park in round 7 and having Poppy Palma and Maddie Bamert nominated as rising stars for the VAFA.
- The Reserves round 17 win against St Bedes in Stephen Hogans final game.
- The Under 19 Blues having a great win vs eventual premier Old Xav's in round 16.
- The Under 19 Golds goal on the siren to beat Beaumaris away in the middle of year.
- And lastly to our Dino's who won their first VAFA masters flag who came back from

5 goals down in the 3rd quarter to beat Marcellin by 16 points with Corey Wilson BOG with his 5 second half goals.

These were just a few highlights, and we are already looking forward to a bigger and better season 2024.

To all our brilliant coaches, assistant coaches, medical team, trainers, runners, team managers, timekeepers, goal umpires, boundary umpires I think you all for your efforts in 2023 and look forward to seeing you all again in 2024.

Finance Report

Coming off a year where we lost over 30k, the committee focused on ensuring we did not have the same loss in 2023. We are pleased to announce that we were able to make a cash profit of around 2k for season 2023.

Although on paper we will still show a loss of 35k this comes down to the following:

- New signage due none being completed for many years
- No thirds team
- Write off old merch and old player apparel
- Staff in 2022 who were not paid in 2022 due to previous agreements
- S&C coach for the Guns and 19's as well as head of Future Football
- Player Fines for Melees
- Thursday meals and players functions being run at cost neutral.
- Team managers for the seniors and reserves
- Acceleration of depreciation

Total for these items Approx: \$76,000

Taking all the above into account, the club has done extremely well to be in the financial position we are in.

A finance sub-committee was formed to keep track on the budget throughout the season being myself, Simon Forer, Roy Meiklejohn and Lorretta Crowe.

Some big improvements in 2023 were the increase in memberships to a new record high of

over 190 - special thanks to Ralph McHenry for his hard work. Ralph is hoping to get this towards 250 in season 2024.

Canteen sales doubled in 2023 thanks to the hard work of all our volunteers who assisted throughout the season and to our local sponsors Clancy's Bakehouse, Jake and the Beans talk, Your Local Butcher, Alexanders Fruit and Veg and Loafers Bakery who provided fresh yummy produce each week.

Our Sponsors always deserve a special mention with record sponsorship again in 2023. The club can not survive without your contributions, and we look forward to working with you all again in season 2024 and beyond.

Thanks to our great community who also helped our raise 40k for the Presidents Raffle and to all who attended the new format after the last home game, a function which will be back in 2024. Special mention to Adrian Morrissy who provided the food for the event.

We still have a lot more areas to improve on in 2024 if we are wanting to be a sustainable A grade club. We need to attract more members, new sponsors, and generate more income to make a yearly profit. All help would be greatly appreciated to help bridge the gap.

Community Engagement

This has been a focus of the club for the past 12-18 months and will continue to be moving forward. Our local community is vital to our success and to also to our continuous improvement.

Seniors Team

Season 2023 was focussed around changing the status quo of our football club. We felt if we didn't change the status quo, we couldn't expect to improve performance and we couldn't expect to win.

The playing and coaching groups addressed this back in November of 2022, and laid the foundation of building a strong supportive culture, changing our attitude on the training track, and learning a new system-based game plan that would allow us to achieve sustainable success. Upon reflection of the season, we can look back and say we have certainly achieved the goal of changing our status quo. We finished the season with a record of 12 wins and 6 losses, finishing 3rd on the ladder, and played the club's first senior final since 2017. A heartbreaking fivepoint loss in extra time in the first semi-final to Beaumaris, certainly hurt and wasn't the way we wanted our season to end. We felt we deserved more and had more to give, but ultimately, we fell short.

This season presented many challenges, the biggest of those being the number of players travelling overseas during the season. Post Covid we knew this challenge would present itself. As challenging as it was, it provided great opportunity for many players to gain exposure to senior football. 45 players played senior footy this year, including ten eligible U19's players, and ten club debutants. For the first time in club history, three Year 12 De La Salle college students debuted in the senior team, which is hugely exciting and refreshing for the future of our club.

Preseason was critical in educating the playing group around a new game style. Each session had a specific focus, and to the playing groups credit, we had great buy-in and consistency with our training. Pre-season camp in Mornington, conducted by Ian Aitken, combined hard work with team bonding and was a day that the playing group thoroughly enjoyed. Our practice games went well, as we were able to reward individual pre-season efforts, and blood some U19's prospects into the senior program. It was a really productive preseason program and we felt we were well-prepared heading into the 2023 season.

The first month of the season we made a strong start. 3 wins 1 loss after the first 4 rounds was great reward for the effort we had put in over the preseason. We were playing a strong, sustainable brand of footy and proving solid defensively. A disappointing loss in round 5 to Fitzroy, followed

by another disappointing loss to St Bedes away in round 6, halted our momentum and suddenly we were back in the pack with a 3-3 record. Wins in rounds 7 & 8, saw us to heading into round 9 against Beaumaris with good momentum and we were looking forward to taking on the then second place Beaumaris on their home deck. Severely undermanned with injury and players overseas, it was always going to be an enormous challenge. On a very windy bayside day, we were able to produce one of our greatest wins of the season, which gave the playing group enormous confidence and belief leading into the second half of the season. We turned at the halfway mark of the season with 6-3 record.

The next five rounds were extremely inconsistent. Our lapses in quarters each week hurt us, resulting in us dropping games to Williamstown and Old Geelong. In both games we were in winning positions but failed to capitalise on the opportunities. After 14 rounds, we were 8-6, and due to other results in our division, we were staring down the challenge of needing to win all our remaining four games to ensure a guaranteed finals position. Knowing what we needed to do, we address that as a group and understood the added pressure that came with that. To the playing groups credit, our ability to compartmentalise and focus on what we could control, was excellent. In rounds 15, 16 & 17 we had wins over Beaumaris, Old Trinity and St Bedes, so we went into the final round needing



to beat Fitzroy on their home deck to secure our spot in the top 4. On a warm September Saturday, we produced arguably our strongest performance of the year. We executed our planning to perfection and had even contribution from the 22 players who took to the field. Closing the home and away season with a 49-point win over second place Fitzroy, was a great way to end the season as we headed towards the clubs first finals appearance since 2017.

We took on Beaumaris in the first Semi-Final at Trevor Barker Oval in Sandringham. Early nerves on our end, and Beaumaris' physicality had us on the back foot early. We felt we couldn't get any momentum into our game and struggled to restrict the opposition up forward. We found ourselves down by 29 points at halftime. Some positional changes, and a reset mindset over the halftime break, saw a completely different De La team in the second half. We took control around the ball, got a ball movement flowing, and looked threatening in our front half. A four goal to two third term saw us reduce the deficit to 15 points at the final break. The last guarter was electric, high stakes, high pressure resulted in some high-quality football from both teams. We were riding the wave of momentum, and through the enormous support of the blue and gold army behind the goals, we were able to kick five goals to two in the final guarter. When the final siren sounded, scores were level, meaning extra time was needed to split the two teams.







Five minutes each way, after four brutal, taxing quarters on a warm day was always going to be challenge. More so given we had been down to 21 men for the last three guarters due to Nick Curwood's concussion. Extra time was a tight tussle and extremely low scoring. Beaumaris kicked a goal early in the first period of extra time as a result of a free kick, and sadly, that provide the difference, as we couldn't take our chances going forward. In the end we went down in a heartbreaking five-point thriller. Not the ideal way to have the season end, but the courage of our group to come back from 34 points down five minutes into the third, to take the game into extra time, showed the giant steps forward in our development that we have taken as a group this season.

I couldn't be prouder of the entire playing group and the resilience they showed throughout the season. Our leaders, led by co-captains Adrian Indovino & Sean Fisher were excellent in the way they conducted themselves and steered the playing group through season. Both Adrian and Sean have grown and developed their leadership skills and complemented each other well with their own unique ways of leading. I have no doubt, if the playing group all stick together, take the disappoint and hurt from the final's loss in the right way, come back hungry to work hard and improve, we will give ourselves the best chance to go a couple of steps further in season 2024. Thank you to the entire playing group for your commitment, dedication, hard work, and resilience you have shown throughout season 2023.

A special mention must also go to all those who have helped and supported us throughout the year. To Michael and the team at East Malvern Physiotherapy, our trainers led by Mackenzie, Ray Bedford (Team Manager), Sean O'Callaghan (runner), Jason Tuner (S & C Team), Bill Tyson, Tom Hyland, Shane Watson, Warrick Dickson and Adrian Morrissy, thank you all for your commitment and amazing efforts throughout the year. I am forever grateful and appreciative of the countless hours you have put in and the support you have shown over the entire season. Thank you also to the Committee led by Phil Proy, our wonderful supporters and all the volunteers that help make our great club. Those that work behind the scenes are no doubt the unsung heroes of our club and I cannot thank them enough.

Thank you all once again and we look forward to the 2024 season. We have unfinished business!

Women's Team (The Guns)

2023 was an incredibly exciting season for the Guns with many new players joining the program, a number of which played their very first season of football.

We began the pre-season in record numbers with 15+ players regularly attending training out of our squad of 25 at that point in time. There was a real level of excitement about the 2023 season as the Guns learnt some new things and built relationships with a number of our new players.

Following a Christmas break, we saw more numbers coming down to training as we continued to add to our group and the level of enthusiasm was evident in their training. The pre season camp was a massive highlight of the lead up to the season with 20 guns partaking in the day alongside our senior mens team before going off to do their own "De La Salvivor" a fun afternoon of activities taken from the hit tv show, Survivor! Under 19 Blues Team

Some may regard Aussie rules a winter sport, but those connected to any well-run organisation such as DLSOC will know that a footy season actually starts when summer is upon us, well before people start thinking about what to cook for Christmas dinner.

Season overview

Head of Football Bill Tyson and the Committee had been hard at work and developed a clear plan for the U19 program, well before the players took part in their first pre-season training in late November. The master plan for 2023 was to enter two teams, both Blues and Golds, which were to be coached by myself and Declan McLaughlin respectively. Both of us had coached the previous season at DLSOC. With a one club game plan in mind, the club very thoughtfully arranged for Head of Coaching Shane Watson, and Head Coach Nick Hyland to assist and offer support to the U19 program. Another new initiative for the season ahead was the introduction of Strength & Conditioning coach Ewen Curnow to the group.

The head count at pre-season training increased week after week during the summer months. The list comprised of a healthy contingent from Year 12, along with some familiar faces from previous seasons, it was soon evident that we were never going to be short on players, even taking into consideration the forecasted mid-winter holiday escape. So after a very productive pre-season, and the launching of our game plan, coupled with data collection and formation of a new online chat group, it was time to get down to business and hit the season proper.

As the Blues were entered into the U19 Premier division, we were under no illusions. Most opposing teams had a reputation of being very strong, we knew that the standard was going to be very high and that the competition was going to be fierce. With seven players making their debut, the Blues started off the season very well with two wins from two games. What impressed most was the maturity and calibre of the bottom age recruits. Players such as Healy and Russell stamped their dominance as key positioned players, and numerous other bottom age players displayed they had what it takes to play at this level. Another telling trend was the strength of our backline, which was very reassuring considering that Cross and Harper, who both had long term injuries, were due to be available for selection mid-way through the season.



Meanwhile, our week to week training routine and program was rolling along very smoothly. With excellent attendance from the players, Declan and myself were able to implement plenty of game sense drills relating to our game plan. The players were also responding very well to Ewen's strength and conditioning program, and were receptive of the potential benefits that his session blocks offered.

After six rounds we had notched up three wins, with the stronger teams in the competition starting to assert their dominance. Round 7 versus St Bedes was a season highlight – an away game against a very strong team, the Blues turned around a 28 point deficit and fought their way back to win in a nail biter by 3 points. Another hard fought win came in round 12 against Old Scotch. Scores were level for most of the game, and then with the final siren imminent, the Blues scored a goal to secure the 4 points. These types of wins throughout the season were testament to the player's belief and strong work ethic.

Although we did experience a few long term injuries throughout the season, our player list was extensive enough to fill 24 spots each week. What did however alter from week to week, although out of our control, was the movement of talented players from U19's into the Senior team. This also occurred with other clubs, as we noticed varying results from a few clubs when they moved players between U19's and Seniors.

Wrap up

The results and ladder positions for Premier division indicated that the competition was generally tight. We finished the season with 8 wins and 10 losses, with only three games separating us from a top four position. Obviously our team were aiming and hoping for slightly better results, but considering the youthful age of the squad, and the prospect of more players from this team playing future senior footy, I am generally pleased with what the players achieved this season.
