

Presidents Report

It is a pleasure to present the 68th Annual Report of the De La Salle Old Collegians Amateur Football Club to the Club and Members.

Can I firstly acknowledge the work of Katie and Phil Proy, Roy Meiklejohn and Col Glover in compiling the contents and shaping this report into such a professional reflection of De La in 2022.

There is no shying away from the fact that the 2022 season was a challenging year in many respects. With the community opening up there were covid cases (and resultant isolation requirements) running rampant throughout the season; this impacted all footy clubs in terms of player numbers, volunteers and supporters. Right up to the final game, the Recess Premiers win, we were dealing with a covid situation that could have changed the result of the game. This typified the challenges of the 2022 season.

Whilst the overall on-field results were not at the level we expect, off-field the Club took significant strides in continuing to build the Club as a significant contributor to our community. However, the multitude of broader issues facing community sport in the current environment resulted in a less than satisfactory financial outcome.

The Year in Review - Football Performance

At the start of the season we embraced new coaches in our senior men's (Nick Hyland from Round 3) and women's (David Cooper) programs. We thank David Madigan for preparing the senior men's team for the season - David unfortunately could not continue due to work

commitments

After a slow start, to their credit the senior men and their coaching group were able to turn the ship around, and made a late charge towards the finals that unfortunately didn't quite go our way. The Guns were in the reverse position, being in the four for the last 9 rounds only to devastatingly lose the fourth spot in the last game against the eventual Premiers. The Guns, our U23s and U19s struggled for numbers at various stages, but I'm confident this will turn around in 2023 and get back to normal (or enhanced) playing numbers.

It was wonderful to witness the Reserves win their first Grand Final in 10 years, a win which is such an important stepping-stone for our men's footy program - congratulations to the players and coaches on your achievement.

We also celebrate our U19 Colts on making the preliminary final and playing their hearts out to go down to Therry's number one U19 team. It was remarkable that we were able to field three U19 teams in a season when most clubs were experiencing reduced player numbers.

The Dinos had another gut-wrenching Grand Final loss, but we commend them for their efforts to get there and look forward to redemption in 2023.

Special mention must go to Bill Tyson, our Football Director, not just for his efforts in managing the Club's overall football program, but



also, together with Brian Waldron, for the vision in developing a significant football rebuild with the School, a partnership that will hopefully pay dividends on and off-field in years to come. The program has placed well-credentialed coaches, with AFL experience, into the School teams, with a resulting win in Division Two of the ACC Senior Football Competition.

Finance Report

The 2022 season was destined to be the most challenging of the three covid-effected seasons, largely due to running a full on-field season with the lingering impact of covid on players, support staff and supporters.

The overall financial performance for 2022 was a significant loss of \$45,000. The loss is clearly a disappointing outcome and can be attributed to several factors:

- The committee embarked on a significant investment program, including the appointment of a full-time General Manager, as well as other minor paid positions and services which are becoming more prevalent in football clubs each year. The committee is of the view this is the direction the Club needs to take to become viable and competitive in the top men's and women's divisions, and that this investment is likely to pay dividends (on and off-field) in 2023 and beyond.
- Events and game-day lunches. It is disappointing to report there was insufficient interest to justify proceeding with our annual Gala Night, and match-day lunches were at the lowest attendance level for many years. Again, covid played a role in this and we trust that supporters will feel safe and comfortable returning to De La events in 2023. The Gala Night and match-day lunches are integral components of our social and commercial areas, and we will certainly review the offerings to improve the outcomes in 2023.
- The drop in Memberships and support of other fund-raising activities also reflects an understandable level of contribution-fatigue in the De La community after two years of

people generously providing much-needed financial support despite very few games being played.

- Increase in admin costs, in particular in communications, cleaning, point-of-sale and training expenses.

Despite these challenges, under the leadership of Phil Proy our Commercial Director, I'm pleased to report the great news that our Commercial Partnerships income grew to record levels in 2022, in particular with a number of new partners coming onboard. To all our Partners listed in this Report I express my sincere gratitude for your support in 2022. And to Phil, thank you for your tireless efforts!!

Our Season Launch in March was also a roaring success that went against the trend of people staying away, and thanks once again to Mark 'Gus' Parker for his outstanding efforts.

Community Engagement

Once gain the Club takes great pride in participating and contributing to a number of theme-based rounds:

- The Fight MND Round
- VicMix Pink Round - Breast Cancer Network Australia
- VAFA Thick and Thin Round
- Road Safety Round

In addition, a number of key initiatives continued to develop in 2022 that built on the Club's position of strength in the community:

- Out of the Blue - tackling mental health and wellbeing
- Blue and Gold Edge - business networking program
- Sport4All - run with Stonnington Council, providing people with disability the opportunity to participate at De La

These initiatives are key pillars to the contribution our Club makes to the community, and we will continue to put them 'front and centre' of our off-field focus. Thank you to those involved in setting up these initiatives - there is a lot of time



and dedication involved in commencing and running these programs, and much work remains to be done in 2023.

New Pavilion

It's difficult to express how disappointed the committee is with Stonnington Council's decision in 2022 to delay re-building the Bert Healy Pavilion for three years, despite reporting to you 12 months ago that building works would commence at the end of the 2022 season.

Whilst we are grateful that some minor renovation work is currently underway to go a small way towards our aging facility being "female friendly", it falls a long way short of respecting the position of our Club in the community, and the importance of providing appropriate facilities commensurate with our female football program.

Award Recipients

Congratulations to 2022 Senior Men's Barry Lyons Medallist Jake Williams, who had an outstanding year, our Senior Women's Best and Fairest Lee McHenry, and all our Best and Fairest winners and award winners who were recognised on Presentation Night. It's a great outcome given both Lee and Jake are offspring of two great past De La players.

Congratulations to Andre Catrice on being recognised as Club Person of the Year, and to Cate Robertson, Ann Maree Mackie, Chris Kelliher, Pauline Catrice and Gill O'Donnell for receiving the President's Award for their tireless work in "putting food on the table".

Volunteer Network

Our volunteers continue to amaze and inspire me with their dedication to our Club, often with no

fanfare and insufficient recognition.

General Manager's Report

I often get asked “How are things going at De La?”, and I find myself always replying “it’s a Big Club that wants to get Bigger!”. This is the best way to sum up the last 5 months, and certainly is the at the core of all decisions being made and strategies being planned.

What is the BIG picture? Always to be better, to be the best.... Wherever that takes us.

In the next 12 months we want 10 football teams, adding a second Women’s team for U19s, and a second U23’s Men’s or Thirds Men’s team. With building relationships with local Junior football clubs (e.g. Ashy Redbacks) and our local school network (e.g. Korowa) we hope to have more players entering our club from feeder teams.

We will have a Cricket team and a Netball team in 2023. Allowing for our footballers and supporters to continue to be engaged with the Club over summer, further expanding our footprint in the Malvern and surrounding areas.

Our partnership with De La Salle College has never been stronger with more activation and involvement in the College Football & Cricket programs, along with College having greater access and usage of Waverley Oval, will form a true link and strengthen the past-player and alumni groups, our assist us financially.

In the next 6 months, upgraded Coaches Boxes to be more modern and fulfil the needs of our

expanding Club. Upgraded Goal Posts to comply with senior dimensions. Two split system air conditioner units in the social room. NBN. Plus other cosmetic changes around the venue to get us through the next 3-4 years...

This Season we managed to take stock, hit reset, and plan the attack. This was seen on field and off field with some significant and some subtle changes being made. None greater than the impact of new Men’s Senior Coach Nick Hyland - Nick has been instrumental in leading the way in the attitudes and behaviours we want to see across all aspects of the Club, no better spokesperson, or ambassador of the Club on where we want to get to, how we are going to get there, and the people we want to come along on the journey, than him.

Professionalism was made apparent in the restructure of the Medical Team, a magnificent group of dedicated professionals, passionate about their role, their players, and their Club. Our Strength & Conditioning led by Brayden Cassar, is at elite level and we made investment in S&C to give him the resources to fulfil his role to his best



standards. Our Physio and Trainers led by Michael Scardimaglia (Malvern East Physiotherapy) set the standards in player communications and game day services. The engine room of the Club, often needing to be counsellors, psychologists, or just an ear to listen, thank you to all the Medical team in Mackenzie, Lauren, Jason L, Jason, Tegan, Lizzie, Moni, and Bianca for all your hard work and dedication.

Seniors Team

Season 2022 was one full of change, growth, and development. After two COVID stricken years, there was a sense of optimism and excitement for the 2022 season.

Pre-season was very positive, with large numbers on the training track and an overall sense of anticipation with the prospect of having our first “full” season of footy for several years.

Pre-season camp in Mornington, conducted by Ian Aitken, combined hard work with team bonding and was a day that the playing group thoroughly enjoyed. Our practice games went well, as we were able to reward individual pre-season efforts, and blood some U19's prospects into the senior program. In a season full of ups and downs, we ended the year with a win/loss record of 7-9, which saw us finish two games out of the top four. 45 players played senior footy this year, including eight U19's debutants, and ten other club debutants, which is hugely exciting and refreshing for the future of our club.

Our win-loss record was a fair reflection of our season. Being a relatively new and inexperienced group, we took a while for things to “click.” Our effort and application were consistent from week to week and we were in the contest for most games throughout the season. The frustrating thing in the first half of the season was our inability to win close games. 5 of our 9 losses

were by margins of less than 16 points, and in each of those respective games, we had our opportunities to win the game. Finishing the year with a percentage of close to 100 shows that we were more than competitive in most games. At times, we showed our best footy was more than good enough against the better opposition, highlighted by our round 13 win against Old Haileybury at home.

As the coach, what I found most pleasing was our ability as a group to learn from our mistakes and improve throughout the season. In the first half of the season, we lost four close games within a five-week period. Some lapses in concentration, poor decision-making, and failure to seize the moment meant we shot ourselves in the foot and cost ourselves victory.

However, to our playing group's credit, we reviewed our mistakes, learnt from them, trained in these scenarios, and executed better in the back half of the season. When we found ourselves in those same situations (in close games) in rounds 13, 14, 15 and 17, we were able to implement what we had trained and executed under pressure to turn the results around to



come out victorious in each of those games. As a result of that four-game winning streak, we went into Round 18 with our season still alive, and a small finals possibility still on the cards. A remarkable effort, considering after round 12 we were third last on the ladder with a 3 and 8 record.

Playing top-of-the-table Uni Blacks away in round 18 was always going to be a tough task. Again, we showed glimpses that our best was more than good enough and we were in the contest until $\frac{3}{4}$ time. Unfortunately, we were unable to sustain the effort in the last quarter as we went down to a quality team by 27 points which bought our season to a close.

Upon reflection, 2022 was a successful year in terms of the development and growth of our young playing group. Being able to expose eight of our U19 players to senior football, plus debut several other U19 graduates from previous years, will no doubt hold us in good stead in years to come. Combining this with getting another season into our third to fifth-year players, along with the guidance of our experienced players, we are starting to build a playing list profile capable of achieving sustained success.

Although we were disappointed not to be involved in finals footy, we can look back on this season and see the progression we have made, and the foundations that have been set as we look to build on and prepare for an enormous 2023 season. Our leaders, led by co-captains Adrian Indovino and Sean Fisher were excellent in the way they conducted themselves and steered the playing group throughout the roller coaster season. I couldn't be prouder of our playing group and the resilience they showed throughout a challenging season. I have no doubt, if we all stick together, and have a collective aim to strive to improve and drive higher standards, we can become a force in 2023. Thank you to the entire playing group for your commitment, dedication,

hard work and resilience you have shown throughout season 2022.

I would personally like to thank Dave Madigan for the unwavering support he has provided me and the club. Having taken over from Dave as head coach in round 3, he has been exceptional with the support, care, and guidance he has provided me throughout the year. Dave has made an enormous contribution to our club and we cannot thank him enough for everything he has done for the De La community.

A special mention must also go to all those who have helped and supported us throughout the year. To Michael and the team at East Malvern Physiotherapy, our trainers, particularly Mackenzie and Lauren, Andre Catrice and Dale Christie (Team Managing), Ben Nethersole (runner), Brayden Cassar (S & C Team), Bill Tyson, Tom Hyland, Shane Watson, Fraser Cameron, Adrian Morrissy and Pat O'Callaghan, thank you all for your commitment and amazing efforts throughout the year. I am forever grateful and appreciative of the countless hours you have put in and the support you have shown over the entire season. Thank you also to the Committee, supporters and all the volunteers that help make our great club. Those that work behind the scenes are no doubt the unsung heroes of our club and I cannot thank them enough. Thank you all once again and we look forward to a huge 2023 season.

Under 23's Team

In many ways after the last 2 seasons of either no football or a truncated season due to the COVID lockdowns this year was always going to prove challenging for the club as it strove to initiate an Under 23's team for the 1st time.

Those challenges included a large number of senior and reserve players retiring from football, senior players looking to travel overseas, some players working weekends and pursuing other sporting options along with a smaller than usual number of Under 19 graduating players due to a change in the age requirements to be eligible for that group and what was an extraordinarily inhibitive injury list across the senior club.

In addition, the standard of competition in the Under 23 age group was far superior to the Thirds competition that some of the players had been playing in the preceding year and the overall spread of quality teams was higher than perhaps had initially been expected. As such, there was a general reticence amongst some of the playing group, but we started with some optimism albeit laced with some hesitancy as to how results would pan out across the season.

To the credit of the players who did suit up they were quickly disabused of the notion that this was just another 3rds competition and they quickly adapted as attendance at training quickly improved, the overall quality of the teams play

improved and results did improve as the season unfolded.

There were some very tough days for the team, along with a really good win against Old Scotch, but to the credit of the players those tough days stood them in good stead for that competition allowed those players to be more "match ready" when they were required to help out in the reserve team throughout the year where they more than held their own.

It was very encouraging to see players such as Ben Melissinos, Dan Melissinos, Max Doherty, Nic Roberston, Trav Shannon, Harry Gustin all play reserve grade football and contribute to that teams on-going success as the injury list grew across the club, but it came at a cost to the Under 23's team overall as we were forced to abdicate our season.

On a personal note I was pleased to see the improvement in Zac Huggins who certainly played very well in games and his confidence grew as he was given opportunities to have more game time and feel his efforts at training and on



game day were appreciated. In addition, I was pleased to see the improvement on a weekly basis from the always smiling and supportive Charlie Langkau who is another of those valuable people to have around the club as they are always willing to be involved and help bring others into the group with their willingness to create a team environment.

As noted above, given the transient nature of some of the Under 23 players who decided to travel along with the extensive injury list the team was given little choice from the midway part of the season but to forfeit a number of games which whilst disappointing was due to events outside the control of the club and those looking to develop a more structured and football focussed pathway for players graduating from Under 19's to seniors and reserves that we have previously had.

I do need to thank the people who assisted us each week – albeit for less than we all would have liked given we had to put this team into abeyance until 2023, but to Chris Huggins who acted as runner, boundary, assistant and is a constant source of optimism he is a valuable person for any football club. To Damien McCormack who came each week to volunteer as goal umpire – this was one less job I needed to and his dry and droll observations about the team and our chances each week were always welcome. To Chris Kelliher who I had to bribe to act as timekeeper – I am very grateful, and I will look to somehow pay that bribe off, and to the match committee led by Bill Tyson and Shane Watson I am grateful for their understanding of what was a difficult season.

The really positive news is that with over 40 players graduating from the Under 19's and many of them will want to still train 2 nights, will want to strive to play at a higher level which will place pressure on reserve players to keep their standards high, but more importantly it will allow some of these boys to develop their footy in a more structured manner as the club overall wants them to be part of the club the future of the Under 23 team is looking good for season 2023 and beyond.

Under 19 Blues Team

2022 began full of promise of the back of a foundation laying season, at least what we had of it! There was a significant group of the U19 Blues from 2021 who would go around again at the same level in 2022, which gave the group warranted levels of optimism heading into the beginning of the season.

Leading into the 2021 season there was a whole lot of change within the playing group and after the non-event of a covid season in 2020, we were slow to get numbers to training which certainly resulted in us being under prepared heading into round 1 of that season. However, heading into round 1 of 2022, we had a much better preseason and were feeling confident in the depth of quality within the playing group.

The opening round saw us take on the newly promoted University Blues on our home deck. It was great to welcome 10 debutants, of which 9 of them were playing their first game for the club. It is always an exciting time of the year and it was great to see so many new faces running around throughout three under 19 teams in our first home triple header in the opening round of the season. What was a sign of things to come was the first of the U19 debutants in the senior team as Harry Hawker made his senior debut down the road against Old Hailebury. As many teams are when they are promoted, Blues were super competitive on the day but lacked the skill required to match our level and we were able to

get off to a good start with a solid 5 goal win.

Round 2 we were excited for the challenge of playing the team that is the benchmark in this competition and has been for some time in the Old Xaverians. We went to Kew full of hope and confidence despite being down to 20 players, we felt the 20 on the park were of very good quality. The first quarter didn't quite go to plan, however after quarter time, we were super competitive and had chances to win the game with the wind in the final term but ran out legs, finishing with no one on the bench due to a couple of injuries. We didn't know at the time, but it would take until round 17 before anyone got as close to Xavs as we did. Despite not winning that game, we felt really confident about what was to come and what we may have been capable of in 2022.

We returned home for a game against ACC rivals in St Bernards. St Bernards are also a strong side in this competition and have been challenging for premierships in recent years, so we expected a tough game. The early stages were tough and contested as they always are against them,



before we were able to break it open in the second half and run away as comfortable 7 goal winners. It was great to see some new names leading from the front in their first handful of games for De La, whilst 'experienced players' (a term I use loosely, they've played 10 games to this point!) making big contributions.

Round 4 was another home game, this time, a 9:20 game prior to the reserves and senior games. On the same day, two more U/19s made their senior debuts with reigning Best and Fairest winner Tom Filipovic and his brother Seb debuting together, both incredibly dedicated and were rewarded for their hard work playing a number of senior games as bottom age U/19s. At the 19s, we took on bottom placed Old Melburnians. We opened up a pretty significant lead which we took to $\frac{3}{4}$ time. That 10+ goal margin was whittled away in the final quarter as the OM's rattled on late goals, whilst never threatening the result, it was a frustrating final quarter.

Following a 3-1 start we were full of confidence going down to Glenhuntly Oval to take on Caulfield, one of the strongest teams of 2021, who certainly had our measure. We felt that we were well placed to challenge them on their home deck. It was a really strange game, not one we ever really got into, however were never really out of either! A 3 goal half time deficit probably felt like more, however it certainly was by the final break where we trailed by the best part of 6 goals. In very quick time we got the game back to within 10 points, only to drop away terribly and lose the game by 7 goals, a really disappointing result, given the start we had made to the season.

St Kevins awaited at home in round 6, a game we felt was certainly winnable, but one we never gave ourselves the chance to win. Whilst the scoreboard suggested we were in the game at half time, it felt as though it was a long way away.

A dominant second half from the visitors saw us go down by over 70 points.

The challenges continued to come, this time not just in the form of our opposition. We got to Camberwell to play Old Scotch in round 7 with what was very much a skeleton team, 19 players including 3 debutants and one playing a second game for the day against the team who at that stage were second on the ladder. Our one rotation in the first half was being used to have players come off to go to the bathroom because they were so unwell, in some comical scenes! As to be expected, Scotch were relentless in piling on the goals, and despite a 20 goal loss, we felt as though the effort from every player on the ground couldn't be questioned. Of the 85 players on our list, we had over 30 unavailable on that weekend across the 3 teams of which the majority had the flu, it was a brutal week at the selection table, suffice to say anyone available had a game, some got two and one played all 3!

A bit of much needed relief came at the selection table in round 8 with many of the boys recovered from the flu, a senior bye bringing back a couple of U/19s as well as a Sandy Dragons bye, we were close to full strength when taking on the Old Melburnians at VAFA HQ and the game was played like it. A dominant performance from start to finish, the skill level and intensity lifted immediately with a 7 goal first quarter and we continued that on from there. It was great to get back on the winners list with a convincing victory over OM's.

Either side of the Queens Birthday long weekend we would face the two eventual preliminary finalists on our home deck in Old Brighton and then Williamstown CYMS. For large parts of both games we were super competitive with somewhat undermanned teams, with a couple of injuries and another senior debutant in round 10, Will McKinnon. At the end of both of these games the scoreboard says we lost by 24 and



22 points respectively, however we were in both games until half way through the last quarter. Unfortunately it was 15 minute lapses that were costing us, something you aren't able to get away with against good teams at this level.

Round 11 was potentially the high point of the year as we went down to Glen Iris station at T H King hoping to avenge our round 6 disaster against old rivals St Kevins. We went with 19 players on a perfect Saturday afternoon, prior to the game there was a feeling that we were capable of getting a win, knowing that we would also have a couple of reinforcements from the colts helping us out in the second half. We went into the half time break with a four-goal deficit, however the attitude remained pretty positive, knowing we weren't far away from getting back into the game and challenging the opposition. From there, we had a 6 goal to 1 third quarter to take a lead into the final break, as good a quarter of footy as we had played for the season. The last quarter was an even struggle but we were able to match St Kevins right to the end and win the game by 9 points, certainly one of the highlights of the year.

Off the back of the strong win in round 11, we went into the final part of the year after the two week bye knowing we had plenty of tough games ahead against finals quality opposition. We had a wrong to right in the first week after the bye against the Caulfield Grammarians. In

many ways the game was similar to the day at St Kevins but not quite the same result. We gave them a 5 goal head start at half time and then reeled it in by $\frac{3}{4}$ time, only to fall by 8 points at the final siren. A week later we travelled to Essendon to take on St Bernards, where we made a positive start in the wintry conditions only to give up some late second quarter goals and have a similar half time deficit as previous weeks. We hung in strongly but couldn't execute as we would've liked for long enough to go down by 3 goals.

Round 14 was a huge highlight for the whole of the Under 19 program with the Senior sides having a bye and the women's teams season over, the Unders took centre stage with a home triple header. We welcomed back round 13 senior debutants Christian Algeri and Campbell Bedford and also Harry Hawker who would play his first game of the season at Under 19 level. We had the strongest side available that we had all season to take on finals aspirant in Old Scotch. We didn't make a great start against the breeze, giving up four quick goals to go into quarter time with a 25 point deficit. We played a very good second quarter without getting scoreboard reward with 3.5 to 1 behind. We weren't able to score in the third quarter while giving up 4 goals. With a 5 goal margin to run down in the last quarter, we weren't able to get the ball into open play as the game turned quite scrappy with the final margin being another 3 goal loss. It was great to have



support of many senior players and also family and friends at the U19 lunch on the day.

The final 4 games were disappointing despite having some positive elements. A bad defeat to Uni Blues who won only 2 games for the year was incredibly frustrating, before playing 3 finals bound teams in Old Xavs, Williamstown and Old Brighton. Whilst we were competitive in patches of all 3 games, we weren't able to sustain it, largely due to the fact we were playing these games with up to 5 less players on the bench at times.

Ultimately, at the end of the day, the win loss record says 5 wins and 13 losses, but I don't think that is a fair reflection of what the group did this year. A number of tight losses, playing many games undermanned against quality opposition makes the win-loss look bad. However, the fact we were able to remain largely competitive in the best local U19 competition in the state is a testament to the boys effort.

The most positive aspect of the season from a club point of view was having a record 8 U19s making senior debuts in 2022. Excitingly, 6 of them are once again eligible for U19 football in 2023. This is an incredibly exciting group coming through and who no doubt will make a seamless transition into the senior program from next year and hopefully well into the future.

A big thank you to everyone involved this year. Thanks to coaches Declan, Simon and Kinna for their support with the Colts and Golds. A huge thanks to Bernie Docherty as team manager, his passion was unrivalled on game day. Thanks also to Liam Kelliher for stepping in at the half way point of the season to help us out with same game day coaching. I think the biggest thank you has to go to Tegan as the head trainer of the U19s. Her commitment and investment in this club and this group has been second to none and has certainly not gone unnoticed and hopefully

not under-appreciated, for the last two years she has been absolutely amazing for us and we are incredibly grateful for her support.

We look forward to what 2023 has to offer and hope there is continued development amongst this playing group, good luck to the boys making the transition into the senior program and I look forward to many more senior debutants coming from this group in 2023.

Finally, thanks to the Mocca, Dale and the footy club for entrusting me with the responsibility of developing the next generation for De La footballers. It is not a responsibility I take lightly, of all years, 2022 has shown the importance of the U19 program and to be leading that program is a true privilege.

Under 19 Colt's Team

It was hard to know what to expect for the 2022 season for the Colts. Most of the footballers I was to be working with I was meeting for the first time in pre-season.

As pre-season continued and numbers grew, I knew very quickly that if capitalized on, this season had the potential to be something special. The group would consist of a great group of Year 12s and bottom age 19s. If the two groups could come together and show commitment to the team, the sky was the limit. With the Blues coach Josh by my side, we took on the big task of preparing three sides for the start of what we hoped was a successful season for all.

We had the toughest start to the season that one could imagine, facing what would become at the end of the season the other four of the top 5 sides, in our first four matches! We came out of this four-match block with only one win to our name and three heartbreaking losses, two by 5 points and one by 7 points when we kicked 1.11 for the game. Most teams would have broken under the devastation of such a rough start to the season but not the Colts, this only inspired and motivated the boys more to push themselves and each other to improve and not let this season slip from under us.

The results of this hard work were evident immediately with the side pulling out back-to-back 100+ point wins, one of which against Melbourne High included a huge 9-goal haul to rising full forward Joel Tyquin. With Luke Lyngberg joining the side and kicking 6 goals on debut in Round 6, momentum was growing, and things were looking promising for the rest of the season.

Round 7 presented an unexpected challenge for the Colts, Collegians had dropped down two divisions to join the Colts and in their very first game had beaten top-of-the-table Bulleen Temp by 100 points. We knew we would have to play our best to be a chance against them and in the face of the game being delayed, our leadership group being unavailable, no bench and external talk that we were no chance, the Colts pulled out an almighty performance to win by six goals. This was an incredible team performance, but it was the day when Aidan Murray announced himself as a real leader of this team, a role he would fulfil for the rest of the season in terms of standards and commitment.



With all of this time playing together our defence really began to click and work as a unit. Our big Round 8 victory against St. Bernards, would mark the fifth straight consecutive week where we kept the opposition team to less than four goals. Round 9 resulted in another big victory against St. Bedes as we prepared ourselves for a very challenging three-week period and a chance for revenge against Bulleen and Xavier. This really showed us how far we have come, knocking over Bulleen by 5 points in a close encounter and Xavier by 4 goals. The team was full of confidence and managed to beat Pegs by 4 goals the following week. Pegs' improvement from their first encounter however showed the side that if Pegs squeezed into finals they would be as hard a side as any to beat.

With the team flying and individuals playing such good footy, it was no surprise to see so many players be rewarded with opportunities in the Blues and Golds. Overall, eight Colts players played in the Blues this season, including 5 schoolboys, which is a great sign for the future. However, this coupled with some of the boys taking their foot off the pedal after such a hard stretch led to our most disappointing performance of the season. A five-point loss to lowly placed St. Kevins would ultimately cost us a top-two finish and double chance. This match was the start of a mini mid-season slump for the Colts, it would quickly be followed by a forfeit loss to Therry Penola and a gallant but frustrating

five-goal loss to Collegians.

We then found ourselves in a desperate position, having to win each of our last three games in order to guarantee a spot in the finals. The boys began to rally at this late stage of the season and gather momentum to take into finals with two huge wins and one hard-fought but comfortable win to close the home and away season.

Finishing third on the ladder the boys were hyped and ready to take on Pegs. With our injury list getting shorter, our eyes were set on going deep into September. Our semi-final against Pegs could be described as nothing less than a rollercoaster. Dominating the first quarter and a half, we looked as if we would run away with the match until a freekick reversal turned the momentum and all of a sudden we found ourselves 4 goals down halfway through the third quarter. The boys had committed too much into this season though to just roll over and accept that this is how the match would continue and that this is the way their season would end. Led by Josh Cumberlidge and Anthony Liakakos the boys slowly but surely crawled their way back into the contest and it was a 50m penalty to Declan Minnett which allowed us to take the lead and eventual victory.

Which takes us to the Preliminary Final. To be honest, the Preliminary Final against Therry Penola is still extremely painful to think about, let



alone write about. We were playing catch-up all day, with poor goal kicking and defence, blowing a margin to a level that wasn't reflective of the contest. In trademark Colts fashion though the boys simply did not quit and pulled the margin back to one straight kick at the final break. Unfortunately, straight kicking was easier said than done for us. We dominated the first two-thirds of the final quarter but could not capitalize, kicking 0.4 and a couple on the full. Therry walking away 10-point winners.

As I and others, fall into the trap of thinking about what could have been, it is important we take a moment to pause and reflect on what overall was an incredible season, filled with so many extraordinary moments and a couple of devastating ones too. All of which we faced side by side as a team, supporting each other in what was a truly special team filled with great footballers and great young men.

Thank you to Josh and Tegan for working by my side from the first day of preseason to the last, Simon and Kinna for your support and understanding through the season, Dale, Bill and Phil for your continued assistance and hard work around the club, Andre for patiently assisting with all the last minute transfers and registrations that comes with U19s football as well as Mocca, the entire committee, trainers and support staff for your belief in myself and the program and values we are trying to implement.

A big thank you to the players as well for your commitment and unwavering support of each other and their coach. It will not be a season I ever forget. The culture which we created in the Colts this season and the good times that we shared, hopefully, lay the foundations for this group to go forward together and continue to bring success for De La and each other both on and off the field. The future is bright. Bring on 2023.

De La Salle College Football Season

The College has launched a new High Performance football program in partnership with the De La Salle Old Collegians Amateur Football Club (DLSOCAFC).

The program is aimed at developing football skills for students from Years 5 - 12 and encouraging participation in the Old Collegians Football Club post-school. Principal Peter Houlihan announced the program at the First XVIII Football dinner in March, saying it was an exciting initiative for the future of football at the College.

“The program, which will run for an initial three years, aims to support and enhance the existing football program, supporting coaching staff and further strengthening connections with DLSOCAFC, by providing pathways for senior students to join the Club,” Mr Houlihan said.

The football program is the first stage of a longer-term strategic plan to promote and enhance a broad range of sports and other co-curricular pursuits at the College.

The College has a long tradition of producing outstanding football players and administrators starting with the legendary ‘Captain Blood,’ Jack Dyer (1932). Since then there has been a strong lineage including, John Kennedy Snr (1945), Bob Johnson (1952), Terry Waters (1960), Frank Dimattina (1963), Barry Breen (1965), Barry Lyons (1966), Peter O’Donohue (1969), Bernie Jones (1970), Peter Murnane (1972), John Kennedy Jnr (1977), Paul Cooper (1986), Brian Stynes (1990), Trent Croad (1997), Andrew Carrazzo (2001), Michael Stinear (2002), Tom Murphy (2003), Brayden Maynard (2014) and brothers Corey (2016) and Jarryd Lyons (2010) just to name a few.

“Andrew Raines, the founder of One on One Football is facilitating the program. Raines’ strong football pedigree and experience as a

coach and mentor will be a genuine asset for the College. His years as top-level player and coach, 129 AFL games with Richmond, Brisbane Lions and Gold Coast, and as the Head Coach at the Gold Coast Suns Academy, make him an ideal figurehead for the program,” Mr Houlihan said.

“Michael Barlow, ex-Fremantle and Gold Coast Suns champion (141 games) and the current coach of Werribee VFL has taken over as coach for the First XVIII, working with College coaches, Peter Harrington and Jon Edgar.”

“Brett Deledio, ex-Richmond and Greater Western Sydney star (275 AFL games), is also on board as an Assistant Coach for the Seniors, as well as working with the younger teams. With further support from Dom Tyson (113 AFL games) and Jimmy House (St Kilda Development Coach) he has run some terrific training sessions with the Year 10 team.”

“Michael Barlow and Brett Deledio have been running the ‘Kennedy Club,’ a High Performance squad for Year 7 - 9s, which has been a tremendous opportunity for our younger players to learn more about the game and develop skills and tactics. Shane Watson, (141 AFL games) the new Director of Coaching at DLSOCAFC, has also lent a hand with assisting our staff and students.”

Mr Houlihan said the program has potential to flow over into other sports as well, with swimming, soccer and basketball programs already operating and the Agar Academy for young cricketers planned for Term 4.
