

Peter McCormack Peter McCormack was at the helm for four years and whilst taking the team back to A Grade taught his players that wins had to be earned and losses hated.

Colin Glover A very versatile player who had a great feel for the game. Played with great courage.

Brian Broderick A very tough charge through defender who put the opposition on the back foot. He was a bit mad which helped.

Shane Wright Was courageous to the extent of madness. Never let the ball get behind him, or an opponent get the better of him.

Jeff Lyons Had magnificent judgement and was always in the right place at the right time. Very skilful and held the defence together.

Barry Lyons Played in both key positions, but was at his best at CHB. Very strong overhead both marking and punching with unequalled courage.

Len Steward Very talented and kicked with both feet. He was used successfully on the forward line, and on his day was a great mark.

Peter Murnane "Swooper" was a magnificent athlete who dominated on the wing and went on to play with distinction for Hawthorn.

Dave Whitelaw Strong, quick, straight ahead centreman who collected many possessions and was a very penetrating kick.

Mark Jansen Had great pace and could carry the ball well into the forward line. He was never tackled due to his evasive skills.

Mick Geddes As always, gave a great contest at CHF and used his skill to great advantage.

Tony Hunt

A very skilful forward who could kick both feet and was very accurate. Went on to play for Richmond Seniors.

Jeff Bothe

Strong, courageous on-baller who could be an effective forward. Strong overhead and a telling left foot kick.

A strong marking forward who was on the end of many good passes from Huntie. Was a beautiful kick.

Ian Geddes A very adaptable player who was at his best on the ball. Could leap, take strong marks and would accumulate possessions.

Claude Ciastowski Developed quickly as a young player into a class ruckman. Palmed the ball beautifully to his rovers and marked strongly.

Henry Halasa Big "H" established himself as one of the stars of the competition in the ruck, CHF and CHB.

John Lynch Would go all day boring into packs and feeding out handballs. Had great judgement and was a high possession getter.
