

Talented and pacy athlete who controlled the half back line with agility, skill, flair and dash. Automatic State representative.

Running from the back-line, long kicks into the forward line and picking up many Victorian jumpers and an "A" Grade B&F in the process.

Ralph McHenry

A great leader who never gave up no matter what the odds. Endeavour and commitment could well have been his middle names.

Strong utility player who put the fear of God into the opposition with his hard at the ball style. An inspiration to his teammates.

Joe Doolan Best remembered for his booming kicks into the forward line and his great pace. Won all Australian selection.

Vin Eddy Magnificent mark and strong kick. Noted for his exciting swerving runs. Laconic personality who transformed on the football field.

Shane Murphy Whether playing on a flank or in a key forward position, Shane always performed in big games. An automatic State selection.

Bernard Dunn High possessions winner who was also a magnificent kick. Knitted the whole team together with energetic and constructive running.

Pat Maher Showed unflinching courage and was absolutely outstanding in his ability to maintain a high standard of consistency in his game.

Allan Groves Whether on the wing or forward line, Allan will always be remembered for his mercurial and exciting play. One of the best kicks in football.

Michael Nugent Arguably De La's most talented player. Won two B&F's in his three years at the club. Crippling injuries stopped his VFL career.

Michael Greene Almost certainly the best amateur player of his era. Tough, courageous and with a single minded desire for success.

Peter Donegan The most competitive player to take the field for D.L.S. Incredible abilities to contest every hard issue and nullify opposition moves.

Simon Beddoe Highly talented, courageous player skilled on both sides of his body. Two premierships, State selection, was cut down by injury.

David Hollier Strong determination to improve saw him become one of the club's very best players. Four premierships and rarely ever beaten.

Peter Czerkaski Came straight from school football in 1984. Struggled early but by the end of the year was sensational. Ran straight and hard at the football.

David Harrington Highly skilled player who invariably played his best football in finals. Left footer who could cut the opposition to pieces.

Barry Lyons President for 4 years with two A Grade premierships, he was well known for his player recruiting skills and single minded determination to make his club the best.

Tony O'Callaghan President of our first A Grade premiership team. Nobody has contributed more over a longer period than Tony.

Tony McIlroy An excellent Secretary, Tony was also a keen member of the social side of the club at the time.

John Mitchell Never made a mistake, cool in a crisis. Another outstanding Secretary over four years.
